ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER GOVERNING MANDATORY FILING OF AFFIDAVIT OF HEIRS

The purpose of the requirement of filing a standardized Affidavit of Heirs is to alert attorneys and self-represented litigants of the need to file the Affidavit of Heirs in intestate cases and to ensure complete information is provided to the court concerning the potential heirs in each intestate estate so that intestate estates can be efficiently probated.

By the power vested in the chief judge under Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution, section 43.26, Florida Statutes, and Rule 2.215 of the Florida Rules of General Practice and Judicial Administration, effective **immediately**, to continue until further order and superseding any provisions in prior Administrative Orders that may be inconsistent, it is **ORDERED**:

All litigants must file the Affidavit of Heirs, attached hereto as "Exhibit A" in every intestate probate case filed within the Ninth Judicial Circuit. This requirement may be waived in an appropriate case by petition or motion to the court.

Litigants must fill-in all required sections of the Affidavit. The Affidavit must be notarized. Any filing subject to this Administrative Order which fails to include the Affidavit of Heirs may be rejected and thus have to be refiled in compliance with this requirement.
